

Asparagus - Worsening supplies and increased pressure on extremely limited availability, combined with an upcoming holiday, have markets elevated and holding with no immediate relief expected. The sizing profile continues to lean toward smaller sizes. Quality is fair at best.

Avocados - Quality is good overall. Mexican supplies are plentiful, and the market is steady to lower. CA and Peruvian supplies are good with steady markets. Colombian supplies are steady with light demand and a steady market.

Berries - Blackberry: Supplies are limited as availability declines during varietal and regional transitions. The market is higher. Blueberry: Supplies are extremely limited as the PNW completes their harvest this week. The market is higher.

Strawberries - Supplies are extremely limited as fields continue to be diverted to freezer production due to weather and quality concerns. The market is stronger.

Broccoli - The market is softer as supplies remain steady to good this week and into next week. Quality is good to very good.

Cauliflower - The market is softer as supplies remain steady to good this week and into next week. Quality is good to very good.

Celery - Supplies have improved this week, resulting in lower markets. Demand is fair to moderate, and quality is good.

Lemons - Supplies are steady, quality is good, demand is strong, and the market is steady. Imports continue to arrive & Mexico's season is beginning with strong supplies of smaller fruit, while larger sizes remain limited.

Limes - Supplies continue to decline as the crop winds down. Reduced harvesting due to weather is allowing fruit to size up, resulting in limited availability of smaller 200–250ct limes. U.S. No. 1 yields remain limited.

Oranges - Supplies are tight, quality is good, demand is strong, and the market is steady. The Valencia crop is peaking on 56/72/88 sizes. Supplies of 113ct and 138ct remain limited due to increased school demand.

Cucumbers - Eastern: Supplies are steady, quality is good, demand is good, and the market is steady. Western: Supplies remain limited with strong demand.

Eggplant - Supplies are steady, quality is good, demand is good, and the market is steady.

Grapes - Supplies and quality remain strong on both. The market is steady with no significant issues expected.

Lettuce - Iceberg markets are higher as demand increases and lower yields are being reported in some lots. Supplies should remain sufficient to cover increased volume. Quality is fair to good. The romaine market is steady, while the romaine heart market remains steady with stronger undertones. Quality is reported as good.

Melons - Cantaloupe production is lighter, and increased demand has strengthened the market. Quality remains excellent, with larger sizing available. Honeydew demand is also strengthening, resulting in a higher market. Sizing is trending larger, and quality remains excellent due to favorable growing conditions.

Onions - Demand is moderate across all colors. Quality is good from all growing regions. Markets are steady.

Peppers - Eastern: Green pepper supplies are plentiful, quality is good, demand is fair to good, and the market is steady. Red & yellow pepper supplies are on alert as supplies are tight, quality is good, demand is strong, and markets are steady to higher.

Potatoes - Supplies remain tighter on larger 40–70ct sizes as the crop is sizing smaller than expected and the market remains active. Smaller sizes and Grade #2 potatoes are showing better availability. Quality is good on most lots.

Squash - Supplies are tight, quality is fair to good, demand is strong, and markets are higher on both yellow squash and zucchini.

Tomatoes - In the Eastern growing regions, frequent rain is delaying harvests across many production areas. Overall supplies continue to trend lighter. Supplies from CA and Mexico remain steady. Markets have strengthened due to reduced availability and increased demand.
